


As a Fair Board, and as a community, we want to give credit where credit is due. Lori Linville Teague wrote the following article about her dad, and there is no way we could improve on it.

My dad became a member of the Mooreland Fair Board, we believe, in 1971 when my parents moved here. His primary job as a fair board member was to head the events on the track... arranging and scheduling events to take place each evening, finding sponsors for trophies, soliciting donations such as equipment and fuel to be used on the track, driving to pick up the bleachers and then spending hours putting them together (before he suggested the bleachers be purchased), and the hundreds of hours he spent conditioning the track months before the fair took place.

My dad took pride in making sure the events held on the track were the best around. He made sure the track was perfect and was bothered by

even the smallest rock sticking out of the well-leveled dirt. Brad (her brother) remembers the fun he had helping Dad and often falling asleep in those early years in the pull-back tractor my dad ran each evening of the fair, most nights well into the next morning. I remember helping him keep track of the distances pulled by the tractors and giving the trophies to the winners.

Dad not only worked the track in Mooreland, but became the "Roving Ambassador" for the Mooreland Fair tractor pulls. Because he pulled our tractor "The Sodbuster" in, not only Indiana, but Michigan, Ohio and Kentucky as well, he made sure that every tractor pull he participated in knew the dates of the Mooreland Fair and the events to be held on the track. He asked this information be announced everywhere we went and Brad and I always knew our job would be to pass out tractor pull flyers to every puller we met.

During fair week, our phone would ring "off the wall" with calls for my dad. Calls would come in from all over Indiana, as well as surrounding states.

Dad took great pride in knowing pullers wanted to come to Mooreland and that many pulling associations considered the tractor pulls at the fair to be among the very best. We take great pride in knowing that our dad had a lot to do with that.

During the years that he headed these events, Dad had a lot of young help who trained under him, like Kenny Johnson and Todd Brown. When he finally decided it was time to let others take over, Kenny and Todd knew just about all there was to know about grooming a track and filling each evening with exciting events, because Dad

Historic band organ to be on display at fair

K.A. Pontus Piano Service of Hartford City will display this Band Organ Friday and Saturday evenings of the Mooreland Free Fair.

It took 8 years to reconstruct to the exact dimensions of an original Wurlitzer Band Wagon Organ. It contains 97 wooden pipes, pressure and vacuum bellows, cymbal, snare

drum and bass drum.

These organs were used on Merry-Go-Rounds and at skating rinks.

This organ plays itself using a perforated paper roll similar to those in player pianos.
