generation Mooreland Fair workers. Jenny works in the fair board food building, serving as one of the general chairmen, along with her mother, Bonnie Greenwell, Jodie Brown, and overall building chairperson, Betty Linville.

Jenny mentioned members of her generation who work in different areas at the fair. Betty's daughter, Lori Clone; Kenny and Andrea Johnson; Terry

Wallen and Jodie Brown's brother, Todd. Jenny and Lori, among others, are actually third generation with the fair since both their grandmothers, Nondis Shaffer (Bonnie's mother), and Luva Acker (Betty's mother), were hard workers in the food building.

Because profits from the food building are a significant portion

of the funds needed to sustain the fair from year to year, an efficient and coordinated operation is very important. The general chairmen of the food building cook and clean, open and close the building, and assist the daily chairmen.

Most of the dozens of people needed to fill the stations of the very organized food service each day (and the many donated homemade pies), are recruited by the daily chairmen from the ranks of their friends and neighbors. Anyone can volunteer to help at any time, and help is always needed.

Jenny says she inherited the job - she didn't just volunteer. She remembers "sleeping on the table while her mother, Bonnie was cleaning up." She even remembers helping "in the tent, when you had to carry in equipment and take it back down." Jenny has been continuously involved except for a few years when her husband, Jim, was serving in the Marine Corps.

"We need younger ones to start working," Jenny

relatives of who have always worked. For example, Jenny's brother, Brian, is "a big help at night. We couldn't do it without him." Some others involved, Jodie's nephews and Betty's grandchildren, are from an even younger generation. The general chairmen might be up "until 1:00 a.m. or so" getting ready for the next day, then start again in the morning with preparations for opening.

Like most of the younger people who work at the fair, Jenny has a full schedule. Recently, she was transferred from the First Merchants Bank in Mooreland to Middletown, where she serves as a supervisor and Customer Service Representative, a position available only at Middletown.

Always before, she was available to handle all the receipts from the food building, depositing them directly in the bank at Mooreland. She says she will still be available for anyone who has questions, but just not in the Mooreland branch on a daily basis. In order to be at the food building late at night and early in the morning, Jenny will take vacation days Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday during the fair.

Jenny's banking knowledge has been a big asset to the fair, as well as to the Mooreland community, whose residents have relied on her for several years to keep their CDs and IRAs up to date and conforming with tax regulations.

Jenny has been married to Jim Cash for 34 years and they live just outside of Hagerstown. Jim and Jenny had three sons, but lost one son, Jamie. His 6-year-old daughter, Zayda, is one of the princess contestants this year. Their son, Josh and his wife, Miranda, have a little boy, Jamie, named after his uncle. Little Jamie will be a year old at the fair this year. Jenny and Jim's youngest son, Jared, recently moved away from home. He is 22 and a cosmetologist.

Jenny is very outspoken about her Christian faith. She attends White Branch Church of the Brethren, where she was baptized a few years ago, as were some others in her family. She says, "I just felt I should do it." Things haven't always been easy for the family, but "Zayda is a blessing to us. She helped us get through a hard time."

Regardless of her career goals, Jenny says, "kids are number one for me."
